SPEAK UP BE SAFE – ABUSE PREVENTION

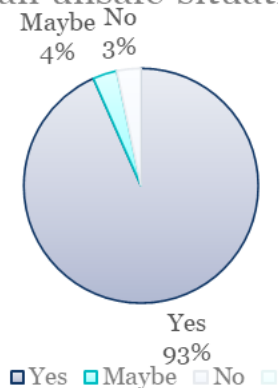


During the 2021-22 school year, Prevention Specialists provided a 1-day abuse prevention program for Flaget Elementary students grades Pre-K to 5th Grade. Pre and post-test assessments were provided to 5th grade students to monitor comprehension of learning objectives. This data is based on a sampling of 30 students.

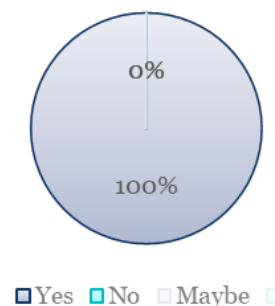
DATA TRENDS

- In the pre and post test assessments, students were asked if they felt they “deserved to be safe.” In the pre-assessment, 90% of students answered that they deserve to be safe. After the program was facilitated, when asked the same question, the answer increased by 7%, totaling 97% of students feel like they deserve to be safe.
- In the pre-assessment, 90% of students were able to accurately define the word “abuse.” After the presentation, 100% of students accurately defined “abuse” in the post-test.
- According to the collected data, 90% of students reported they learned new ways to keep themselves safe and 93% reported that they felt more comfortable to speak up in an unsafe situation.

Physical abuse is when someone hurts my body on purpose

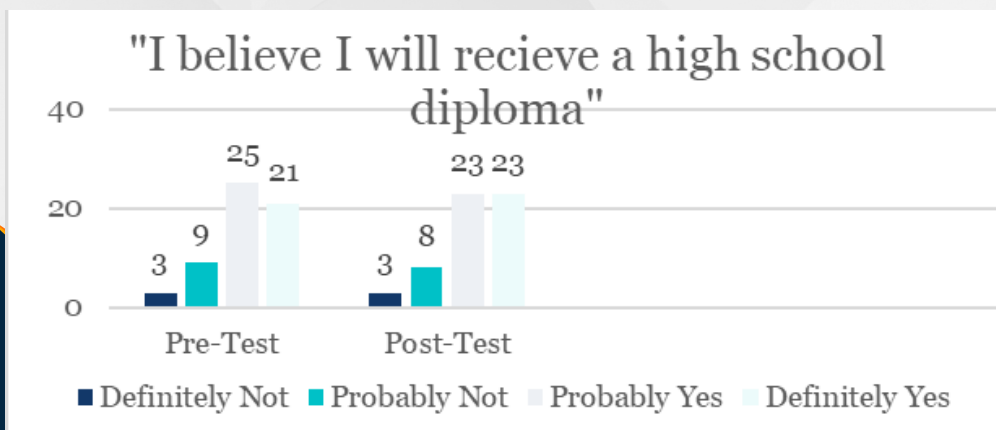


BOTVIN LIFESKILLS - 3RD & 4TH GRADE

During the spring semester of 2022, 3rd and 4th grade Flaget students received an 8-lesson LifeSkills education program, facilitated by a CFS Prevention Specialist. In this evidence-based program, students received a comprehensive and developmentally appropriate substance use and violence prevention program that aims to increase self-esteem, develop healthy attitudes, and improve their knowledge of essential life skills – all of which promote healthy and positive personal development and mental health. This data is based on a sampling of 57 students.

DATA TRENDS

- In the pre and post-test assessments, students were asked if they believe they will receive a high-school diploma. This data point is asked to gauge students' perception of academic achievement before and after receiving LifeSkills Training. By the end of the 8-sessions, students showed an increase in their belief of academic achievement.
- 98% of students were able to name at least one healthy relationship they have in their life. Common answers included "parent/caregiver, teachers, and friends."
- At the end of the 8-sessions, over $\frac{3}{4}$ of the students were able to answer questions correctly about smoking/vaping regarding physical effects, addiction, stress, and decision making.

COUNSELING SERVICES

During the 2021-2022 school year, Flaget Elementary and Rivet Jr./Sr. High School received counseling and group therapy services from a MSW therapist from CFS. Therapist provided 1-on-1 and group interventions with at-risk youth in grades kindergarten through senior year.

DATA TRENDS

- From September 2021 to May 2022, the number of students seen by therapist increased from 10 to 18.
- For the duration of the 2021-2022, therapist reporting engaging an average of 7 teachers or caregivers every given month.
- The most common reasons students were seen by therapist include social skill/communication issues, anxiety, and poor impulse control or behavioral issues.
